**Food Autonomy Kft. treats any personal data in accordance with the current legislative provisions – Act CXII of 2011 on Informational Self-Determination and Freedom of Information ("Privacy Act") and Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, "GDPR")**

**1. Data collector**

### **3. Purposes of data processing**

We process your personal data for the following purposes:

- a) to send newsletters to customers (qualifying consumers) about our products, services, offers, news and events, for this purpose we collect the following data: name, e-mail address;
- b) to send newsletters to our business partners about our products, services, offers, news and events, for this purpose we collect the following data: name, e-mail address;
- c) to reflect on comments, resolve questions or complaints made by you with the use of our contact form, for this purpose we collect the following data: name, position, e-mail address, phone number, country;
- d) to protect and enforce Food Autonomy's legitimate interest in case of any dispute or legal claims arising between us in connection with the above.

Further processing of personal data that is not covered by this Privacy Policy may only take place with us providing you with a new Privacy Policy explaining all conditions relating to the new data processing prior to the new processing commence. If required, we will seek your consent before starting the new data processing activity.

### **4. Legal basis of data processing**

The legal basis of data processing activities indicated in point a)-c) Section 3 of this Privacy Policy lies in Article 6 (1) (a) of the GDPR, i.e. such processing activities will be based on your consent.

The legal basis of data processing activities indicated in point d) Section 3 of this Privacy Policy lies in Article 6 (1) (f) of the GDPR, i.e. such processing activities will be based on the legitimate interests pursued by the controller or by a third party. For such data processing Food Autonomy will carry out a test of balancing interests.

### **5. Transmission of personal data**

Food Autonomy, in principle, does not transfer your personal data to persons who are third parties within the meaning of the GDPR.

Transferring your personal data may only occur for compliance with a legal obligation to which the controller is subject or for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the controller or by a third party.

### **6. Storage of personal data**

In the case of consent-based data processing, personal data will be processed until the consent is withdrawn.

We may also process your personal data for the time required consistent with the purposes set out in this Privacy Policy or for the period of limitation prescribed in the relevant laws. In case of a proceeding before a court or an authority, the personal data will be retained until the termination of the proceeding, including the duration of any possible remedy.

### **7. Your personal data protection rights**

Pursuant to the applicable data protection law you may have the right

- a. to request access to your personal data,
- b. to request rectification of your personal data,

- c. to request erasure of your personal data,
- d. to request restriction of processing of your personal data,
- e. to request data portability,
- f. to object to the processing of your personal data (including objection to profiling; also other rights in connection with automated decision-making),
- g. to withdraw your consent.

You can withdraw your consent at any time without giving any reason to us when the processing of your personal data is based on your consent. However, the withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal. We ensure that you are able to withdraw your consent as easy as it was given.

You can opt-out of receiving newsletters from us at any time, by using the unsubscribe link in the emails we send, or by sending us a message.

## 8. Legal remedies

- a. Complaint with the competent data protection authority

If you feel that the processing of your personal data have breached the provisions of GDPR or this Privacy Policy, you are entitled to lodge a complaint with the Hungarian Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information (Nemzeti Adatvédelmi és Információszabadság Hatóság; "NAIH", address: H-1055 Budapest, Falk Miksa utca 9-11; mailing address: 1363 Budapest, Pf.: 9.; phone: +36 (1) 391 1400; telefax: +36 (1) 391-1410; e-mail: [ugyfelszolgalat@naih.hu](mailto:ugyfelszolgalat@naih.hu)).

- b. Judicial remedy

If NAIH fails to address your complaint or does not inform you on the actions taken or results of the proceedings initiated on your complaint or otherwise you believe that the processing of your personal data breaches the provisions of GDPR you are entitled to seek judicial remedies.

You may initiate judicial proceedings against NAIH or Food Autonomy before the competent regional court according to your habitual place of residence.
